Hazon Monthly Report. March 2016

This is/was a month with intimations of spring and looking to the future.

The process of strengthening our systems, in all respects (including aspects of this report itself) is in better shape than we were in 6 months ago – not yet where we'd like to be six months from now.

We partnered with CLAL, Bend the Arc, Hadar and the Institute for Jewish Spirituality on a retreat that made the front page of the Jewish Week on the development of "new paradigm Jewish spiritual communities."

In San Diego, Gabi Scher led a successful pilot "Hazon Food Project" – a series of events in different places which went well and which we'll look to extend next year, not only in San Diego but perhaps in other locations also.

In Israel we led a second successful Israel Sustainable Communities tour.

Internally, we began the month with a fairly successful and well-attended board retreat, and ended it with a series of all-staff retreats at Isabella Freedman.

Hillel International Base

Many folks who are in the Hazon demographic but had never been to IF before were in attendance - a testament to the potential of organizational retreats to expand our core constituency.
