Adamah

We had multiple guest instructors visit and lead great workshops/classes for Adamahniks-- Joanna Kent Katz, Rabbi Jill Hammer, Rebekah Erev, and Sarah Chandler. We did a facilitated conversation with Camp IF seniors, and it was wonderful for both Adamahniks and seniors, and worth replicating in the future.

Colorado

This month we opened up the application process for our annual mini-grant program. This will be our sixth year allocating \$20,000 to JOFEE programs in the Denver/Boulder area. We also collected final reports from our grantees from the 2015-16 mini-grant cycle; there were many impressive grant projects! Moishe House Boulder wrote, "Thanks to Hazon and our incredible community, we've made great strides in reducing our footprint, educating our community, and cultivating and spreading a sustainable mindset. We love having Hazon here to help make our greening efforts possible and will definitely be applying for another grant soon!"

We submitted four proposals to prospective funders and had an important stewardship meeting with our current primary funders.

Detroit

 presentation on fresh, local foods to Birmingham Temple social action committee to pre-promote food

- Tamarack Farm Planning Day
- Challenge Detroit Challenge Detroit chose Hazon Detroit as one of the 40 end of year projects. This
 event was the final presentation of findings. This is a great new partnership with organization that
 creates social entrepreneurial fellowship opportunities, placing fellows at non-profit orgs.

New York

- Art Kibbutz Nigel gave a class about environmentalism and sustainability to the art house on Governors Island. The NY-based staff later visited Art Kibbutz.
- Climate Action Shabbat Dinner (with Moishe House) The Climate Action Shabbat Dinner was an
 educational, community engagement event that galvanized participants to compost, eat organic food,
 and do environmental advocacy.

San Diego

In San Diego, we are planning for our first Hazon San Diego Bike Ride in March, 2017. We have hired part-time consultant, Amy Scher, and we are currently working to develop our ride committee and strengthen our partner and sponsor relationships. We are looking forward to engaging the San Diego community through our Bike Ride in 2017.

Tribe Rides

This is the new name of the various free local rides that we are running in cities across the Northeast

- Cycle and Stretch (NYC) We cycled around Central Park and then joined JCC Manhattan 20s+30s for a yoga session on the rooftop, followed by drinks and snacks.
- Capital Crescent Trail (DC) In an effort to strengthen our ride community in the DC area, we ran a 30-mile ride along the Capital Crescent Trail and engaged riders from DC, VA, and MD.

JOFEE Fellowship

Successful and well-received webinar on JOFEE, Social Justice, and engaging with Jews of Color and the Black Lives Matter movement with special guest presenter Tonda Case. JOFEE Fellow Becky Adelberg at JCC Chicago

ran a successful Shabbat on the Lake event with several hundred attendees, with JOFEE Fellow Shani Mink running a pickling table representing Pushing the Envelope Farm. JOFEE Fellow Michael Fraade at Louisville JCC ran Summer Seeding: seeding fall veggies in the garden plus tables run by partner organizations with games, info on getting local fresh food, organizing for our Fresh Stop Market, children's activities, etc.

This webinar was especially helpful in thinking through an upcoming session I am running about food justice- I have a better frame for understanding racial justice through a Jewish lens, as well as a focus on embracing Jews of Color as family and leaders in this work."

JOFEE Fellowship stakeholder and partner (and longtime Hazon ally) Karyn Moskowitz got great press for her New Roots Initiative alongside JCC Louisville and JOFEE Fellow Michael Fraade:

Hazon Seal

Our <u>Seal pilot sites</u> worked this month to complete one Seal audits and have chosen (or are in process) three sustainability projects to execute this year. Hazon staff has held consulting meetings or calls with the organizations to facilitate this process. Projects include a new chicken coop at Congregation Bonai Shalom (Boulder), a community composting program at B'nai Jeshurun (Manhattan), and a sourcing sustainable animal products initiative at JCC Staten Island. We have added a <u>Jewish sustainability resource bank</u> to the Seal platform, with introductory greening guides, JOFEE lesson plans, etc., which continues to grow.

To streamline the Seal planning process, we have consolidated several Seal advisory committees into a single advisory board that will oversee the Seal moving forward.

Hazon played a lead role in organizing Jewish attendance at the March for a Clean Energy Revolution in Philadelphia, where we advocated for a strong national renewable energy agenda on the day before the Democratic National Convention. The more than 50 people who joined a Jewish bus from New York received Hazon t-shirts, Hazon-made posters and banners, promotion about the Ride, and a dvar torah from Nigel. Nigel was also interviewed by Grist.
