



Hazon is seeking part-time interns to work with our staff and volunteers in both the Denver area and the Boulder area. We are looking for people who can work 8-12 hours week. The weekly schedule and start and end dates are flexible; the minimum internship length is four months. Internships are unpaid; mileage reimbursement is provided.

Depending on the season, responsibilities vary. To learn about what an internship would entail based on the dates you are available, contact us. We are flexible and like to design internships to suit the skills and interests of the interns. Primary responsibilities may include:

- Helping plan meaningful Jewish outdoor, food, and environmental education programming.
- Helping plan and execute our annual Jewish Food Festival.
- Assistance in planning and executing Tu B'Shvat, Sukkot, and other holiday events.
- Supporting our volunteer Advisory Board.
- Conducting follow up evaluations with former participants in Hazon's institutional Food Audit.
- Conducting follow up and outreach to local alumni of Hazon's Food Conference and Bike Ride retreats.
- Participation in Hazon's weekly all-staff meeting (conference call format).
- Other work as needed and complementary to Hazon's needs and intern's interests and skills.

Hazon has benefitted greatly from the presence of energetic and passionate interns. We are committed to offering interesting, fulfilling, and fun internship experiences to give you practical work experience and a firsthand view of a successful nonprofit organization. While you will provide some useful assistance to Hazon, you will gain valuable on-the-job training that will assist you with your future career search. You will have a supervisor who will work with you closely to set your own personal goals for your internship experience and help you develop marketable skills for your future. Your supervisor will be your resource to make sure you are on track and will meet with you regularly, providing effective feedback and meaningful guidance.
