

Dear Rabbis,

As the Environmental Commissioner of Ontario, I am writing to ask that you draw the attention of your community to the climate change report that I have delivered to the Ontario Legislature on their behalf, during your upcoming Tu B'Shvat celebrations. There is no more important environmental issue.

As you may know, I am an independent legislative officer, required by law to report to the Ontario legislature every year on, among other things, Ontario's progress in reducing its greenhouse gas emissions. **Our reports are nonpartisan and fact-based**, and we do everything within our power to make them **reliable and useful**.

In accordance with this mandate, I recently delivered my first climate change report as the Environmental Commissioner



of Ontario. This report should be useful to all of Ontario's communities as we struggle to find a moral and effective response to the urgent crisis of climate change. Climate change may fairly be considered of particular importance to the Jewish community, both because of its impact on the habitability of the Middle East, and because of the frequent scapegoating of Jewish communities at times of stress, conflict and upheaval. It also presents a direct call to action in light of our traditional commitment to tikun olam, and the current discussions of Ontario energy policy.
