Hazon is the Jewish lab for sustainability. We're the largest dedicated environmental organization in the American Jewish community. In aggregate we're seeking to shift the nature of what it means to be Jewish in the 21st century – enabling and encouraging Jewish people to have an impact in the world and transforming Jewish life in the process. We are based in New York City and the Isabella Freedman Jewish Retreat Center in Falls Village CT. We also have offices in Denver, Boulder, and Detroit.

Hazon has benefited greatly from the presence of energetic and passionate interns. We are committed to offering interesting, fulfilling, and fun internship experiences to give you practical work experience and a firsthand view of a successful nonprofit organization. While you will provide useful assistance to Hazon, you will gain valuable on-the-job training that will assist you with your future career search. You will have a supervisor who will work with you closely to set your own personal goals for your internship experience and help you develop marketable skills for your future. Your supervisor will be your resource to make sure you are on track and will meet with you regularly, providing effective feedback and meaningful guidance.

In November of 2019, Hazon will partner with up to 15 Jewish organizations across the Front Range on the Seal of Sustainability program, exploring the intersection of Judaism, food, and sustainability and resilience. Hazon is seeking up to two part-time interns to work two days a week with our staff and volunteers, beginning in August or September.

Interns must have their own phone, computer and transportation.

Responsibilities include

- Assist with the planning and support for this program. It will be a well-rounded experience including programming, logistics, volunteer management and promotion.
- Supporting staff in planning and running a variety of environmentally based programs at Ekar Farm and in developing our regenerative practice protocol
- Optional: Participation in Hazon's all-staff meeting (conference call format), which happens 2 – 3 times a month.
- Other work as needed and complementary to Hazon's needs and intern's interests and skills.

Qualifications

- Interns are given real work and real responsibilities and we look for strong candidates who can really get the job done.
- The ideal candidate will be informed and passionate about the intersection of food and environmental justice, sustainability and Jewish life.
- Organized, responsible and reliable, self-motivated, detail-oriented, an excellent interpersonal communicator.
- Have a professional demeanor, be comfortable talking with new people, excited to learn new things, able to do small tasks while thinking big, and a team player who contributes to a friendly work atmosphere.
