Location & Parking

The Food Festival is taking place at Congregation Rodeph Shalom, 615 North Broad Street, Philadelphia, PA 19123. We highly encourage you to take public transportation, bike, or carpool. There is complimentary parking available at 658 Watts Street ([Click here to see on google maps](#)), which is just a few steps from the main entrance to Rodeph Shalom, located on Mt. Vernon Street. *Please note: Rodeph Shalom's parking lot is currently under construction and reserved for their religious school. You may be towed if you choose to park there.*

Schedule

The doors to the Food Festival will open at 9:30 am*, and activities will begin at 10:00 am with morning services, yoga, and a service project. Keynote panel discussion will begin promptly at 10:30 am, followed by a 12:00 pm lunch catered by Blackbird Pizzeria and a chance to shop at the Shuk. The afternoon is chock-full of inspiring lectures, discussions, DIY projects, films, and more.
