Hazon is seeking a Store Manager to run the physical gift shop at the Isabella Freedman Jewish Retreat Center and Hazon's online store. We are also seeking to better integrate our store sales (currently processed via Lightspeed) with our Salesforce database. The store manager will lead a research initiative into best options, present proposals, and oversee the integration. This position is based in Falls Village, CT.

Responsibilities include:

Manage and oversee in-person and online sales

- Staff counter or ensure that counter is staffed as necessary
- Train people to serve as bookstore clerk
- Review all sales transactions
- Respond to online and phone orders promptly, shipping items by next day
- Update website with new products and remove obsolete products
- Expand the offerings and reach of our online store
- Maintain cash drawer

Administer Lightspeed point of sale software system

- Add/delete user users
- Make software updates as necessary
- Interface with Lightspeed and other vendors in case for troubleshooting

Reporting

- · Run end of day reports, review for any discrepancies and submit to accounting
- Submit expense reports to accounting
- Run quarterly consignment reports and request payments for vendors

Inventory

- Manage inventory of all of our products: Adamah, food, sundries, books and other items
- Place orders of product from our vendors
- Analyze what is selling and what isn't and adjust inventory accordingly
- Count an annual physical inventory count
