

Welcome to the 2019-2020 JOFEE Fellowship Application! We're so glad you're here.

JOFEE Fellowship candidates may apply either independently or in tandem with a host institution as either an existing employee or nominee. If you are applying with a specific host institution, a supervisor or other qualified staff person must also complete the host application separately.

This summary is intended to help you prepare your application for the 2019-2020 JOFEE Fellowship (Cohort 4). Questions contained here are the same as those on the online application form. Formatting has been adjusted for ease of use.

You must complete the <u>online application form</u> to apply. Applications sent by email or snail mail will NOT be accepted.

Please note: our online application form does not auto-save responses, and may also time out if you stay on the application page too long. We highly suggest that you review the entire application before beginning, prepare your responses on a separate document, and then cut and paste them into the online application when ready.

Applications are due October 5, 2018. Applications submitted before the deadline *may* be reviewed on a rolling basis, with subsequent interviews for qualified candidates; in general we will be in touch in mid-October to schedule interviews.

Successful candidates will be provisionally accepted into the Fellowship as finalists, with full acceptance taking place after a successful match, including interview(s) and confirmed employment offer/contract from the host institution.

Background and Experience

For questions 1-3 below, please be sure to refer to your JOFEE-specific experiences when applicable. If you have not had a JOFEE experience, refer to comparable experiences, preferably in the areas of formal or informal Jewish learning, Jewish communal work, outdoor leadership, or programs related to food or environmental education. Include program dates and role(s) (e.g. participant, educator, fellow) when applicable. **Please do not** feel the need to exhaustively detail the same information here that is on your resume. Rather, use this as an opportunity to highlight specific relevant experience(s).

 - a. JOFEE Fellows will be moving into new roles and, for many, new locations. Tell us about a time when you stepped into a similar situation. What was challenging, and how did you learn and grow during the experience?
 - b. Tell us about a project, program, or significant ongoing task that you managed independently. How did you organize the project/program and move it forward? How did you handle complications and roadblocks throughout the process?
 - c. Success as a JOFEE Fellow will require working effectively with volunteers, stakeholders, and other professionals in your host community. Tell us about a time when you worked in this type of collaborative setting. What was successful, what was challenging, and what did you learn?

Placement Preferences

Fellows may be placed at either existing JOFEE organizations or at Jewish communal institutions located in the US. Successful candidates will be provisionally accepted as finalists, with full acceptance contingent upon a successful match. Prospective host institutions must also undergo a parallel application process. Your responses to these questions will help us to determine the best fit between you and potential placements, in conjunction with information gathered during interviews with Hazon and potential site placements.

Feel free to think big, while also considering your current skills and experience, the training you'll receive at the start of the Fellowship, and the timeline of the Fellowship placement (approx. eleven months beginning February 2019). If you are applying in tandem with a host institution, please respond in that context. (500 words or less)

Please list the names, titles, relationship, and contact information (email and phone) for three professional references that may be contacted by Hazon for a recommendation on your behalf.

You may include one academic reference. This reference does not need to be from an accredited institution, but must be able to speak to your achievements and capabilities as a student and member of a learning community.

I give my consent for these references to be contacted at any time following submission of my application. I also understand that relevant information may also be gathered from internet searches and via conversations with individuals to whom candidates are known (though not necessarily identified by candidates as references). Please note that your consent is required for your application to move forward. (Y/N)

- 4. Relevant articles, publications, or other media you've written or created, either in PDF format or via links to online media
- 5. A Dvar Torah you've written or delivered on a JOFEE –related topic
