Hazon is the Jewish lab for sustainability. For over 18 years, we have been doing all that we can, directly and indirectly, to integrate a commitment to sustainability into the fabric of Jewish life. We strive to connect people with the earth, to interweave Jewish teaching with environmental education, and to support efforts to live more sustainably. Rich programming and innovative activities have been instrumental in deepening Jewish knowledge and increasing our reverence for the natural world that sustains us.

How can the Jewish community make our world healthier and more sustainable?

There are about 6.7 million Jews in the U.S. And there are over 4,500 Jewish institutions – including synagogues, day schools, summer camps and community centers – that collectively have the potential to significantly reduce our environmental footprint, thereby having a direct and tremendous impact on the health and sustainability of our planet.

Hundreds of these organizations are expected to participate in the Hazon Seal of Sustainability over the next few years. Collectively, these organizations will:

- Take action on climate change and other environmental hazards
- Launch vibrant Jewish environmental education programs to **reach over 129,000 participants**, making Judaism come alive
- **Save over \$4M per year** via energy efficiency upgrades and switching to reusables
- Significantly minimize pollution and food waste to help meet national and global sustainability goals

- Plant a garden or host farm animals to be used in vibrant Jewish education programs

- Pass a board resolution to make the synagogue zero-waste and styrofoam-free

- Publicly announce participation in the program
- Build or strengthen an existing Green Team
- Complete a Hazon Seal audit
- Accomplish substantive sustainability projects that have long-lasting impact
- Provide information, data and media depicting projects’ impact
- Engage in new sustainability projects for the next year
