- You must be able to commit to 10-30 hours of work per week.
- The internships will be unpaid; if you are a student, academic credit may be available.
- Interns must have their own computer, phone, and work space.

Brit Hazon Intern

Hazon is developing a new program, the Brit Hazon, that will engage thousands of individuals in making personal commitments to change their behaviors to be more environmentally sustainable. Storytelling is a powerful element in initiatives aimed at behavioral change.

Hazon is seeking a part-time intern to work with Hazon's National Programs department for 10-15 hours/week for 3-4 months in the window of July - October. This position is remote (and hence we can accept candidates anywhere in the USA) and will be supervised by Becky O'Brien, Director of Food & Climate.

Primary responsibilities:

- The intern will develop and execute a storytelling strategy for the Brit Hazon. This will likely include developing interview questions, interviewing Brit Hazon participants, collecting photographs, and putting together compelling stories to be shared on multiple platforms.
- Optional: Participation in Hazon's all-staff meeting (online), which happens 2-3 times a month.
- Other work as needed and complementary to Hazon's needs and intern's interests and skills.

The ideal candidate will be interested in (and perhaps even passionate about) the intersection of sustainability and Jewish life, be organized, responsible and reliable, self-motivated, detail-oriented, an excellent interpersonal communicator, have a professional demeanor, be comfortable communicating with new people, excited to learn new things, able to do small tasks while thinking big, and a team-player who contributes to a friendly work atmosphere.

Marketing & Communications Intern

Hazon is seeking a part-time intern to work with Hazon's Special Events Team for 10-15 hours/week for 3-4 months in the window of July - October. This position is remote (and hence we can accept candidates anywhere in the USA) and will be supervised by Sara Pilavin, Special Events Coordinator.

Primary responsibilities:

- The MarCom (Marketing & Communications) Intern will develop and execute an online engagement and communications strategy for 2020 Vision Ride participants in partnership with Hazon's MarCom and Special Events teams.
- The intern's work will likely include interviewing and writing profiles of riders, featuring interesting rider stories, crafting TedTalk style videos, editing video updates and final event slideshow. Regular social media updates on different channels, boosting posts/ads, conceiving and facilitating viral social media challenges, building community in Rides Facebook group. Research and launch other channels/tools (i.e Strava Challenges, RideWithGPS)
- Optional: Participation in Hazon's all-staff meeting (online), which happens 2-3 times a month.
- Other work as needed and complementary to Hazon's needs and intern's interests and skills.

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Events & Database Intern

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Outreach & Community Building Intern

Hazon is rolling out a new summer event, the 2020 Vision Rides, for participants to help us collectively reach 360K miles & raise 360K dollars. We're hoping to use this not only as a fundraiser, but as an opportunity to create community during this complicated time, and a way to jumpstart effecting change in our own lives, leading to greater change worldwide.

Hazon is seeking a remote part-time intern to work with Hazon's Special Events Team for 10-15 hours/week for 3-4 months in the window of July - October. This position is remote (and hence we can accept candidates anywhere in the USA) and will be supervised by Sara Pilavin, Special Events Coordinator.

Primary responsibilities:

- We are looking for an Outreach & Community Building Intern to help us with the 2020 Vision Rides initiative. This will include heavy front-facing with our participants, building community among participants, supporting events, motivational challenges, and compiling training tips.
- Other work as needed and complementary to Hazon's needs & intern's interests/skills.
- Optional: Participation in Hazon's all-staff meeting, which happens 2-3 times a month.
