- The internships will be unpaid; if you are a student, academic credit may be available.
- Interns must have their own computer, phone, and work space.

Outreach & Community Building Intern

Hazon is rolling out a new summer event, the 2020 Vision Rides, for participants to help us collectively reach 360K miles & raise 360K dollars. We're hoping to use this not only as a fundraiser, but as an opportunity to create community during this complicated time, and a way to jumpstart effecting change in our own lives, leading to greater change worldwide.

Hazon is seeking a remote part-time intern to work with Hazon's Special Events Team for 10-15 hours/week for 3-4 months in the window of July - October. This position is remote (and hence we can accept candidates anywhere in the USA) and will be supervised by Sara Pilavin, Special Events Coordinator.

Primary responsibilities:

- We are looking for an Outreach & Community Building Intern to help us with the 2020
 Vision Rides initiative. This will include heavy front-facing with our participants, building
 community among participants, supporting events, motivational challenges, and
 compiling training tips.
- Other work as needed and complementary to Hazon's needs & intern's interests/skills.
- Optional: Participation in Hazon's all-staff meeting, which happens 2-3 times a month.

Jewish Youth Climate Movement Intern

The Jewish Youth Climate Movement (JYCM) was founded by Hazon in 2020. We are dedicated to mitigating climate change by empowering teens, mobilizing our communities and taking action. JYCM believes in using Jewish values as a motivation to create a more equitable and sustainable world for all.

Hazon is seeking a part-time intern to work with Hazon's National Programs team for 10-15 hours/week for 3-4 months in the window of mid August - mid December. This position is remote and will be supervised by Liana Rothman, National Programs Coordinator.

Primary Responsibilities:

Support the expansion of JYCM chapters nationally.

- Reach out to Jewish and non-Jewish communities to help establish partnerships in this work.
- Identify potential funding opportunities through prospect research and collaborate with the Hazon fundraising team to develop a fundraising strategy.
- Support recruitment strategies (JYCM members and potential advisors).
- Support the development of curriculum.

Support projects executed by the Communications, PR, and Actions and Advocacy Teams.

- Campaign support: Advise leadership board members as they run and organize events related to climate strikes, legislative lobbying, climate advocacy and other actions.
- Support the communications team in creating a monthly newsletter, improving the website, and building a social media presence.
- Work closely with the E-board.
- Have one-on-ones with members to provide mentorship and help them troubleshoot.

As the JYCM intern, you will learn about the spectrum of Hazon's work. In addition, there will be opportunities to learn and work with Hazon staff at weekly staff meetings, as well as opportunities to present your work to Hazon staff and partners.
